Caleb: NO!

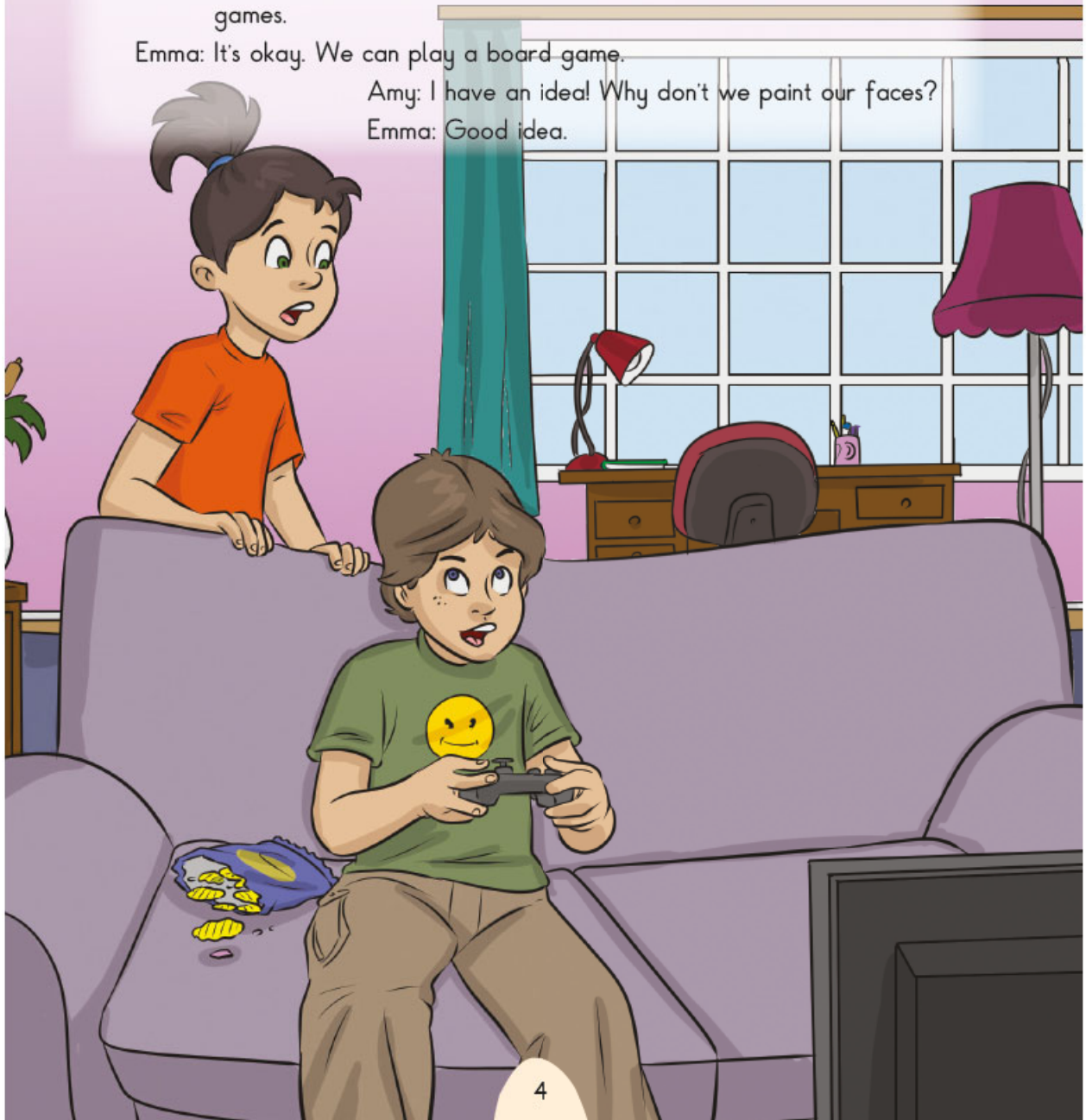
The girls go to Carol's bedroom.
