

ABOUT THE PLAY

Macbeth is one of William Shakespeare's most popular plays, and it is his shortest tragedy. It has been performed on stage since his time. It was written between 1603 and 1607, during the reign of King James I of England. Throughout the centuries, the roles of Macbeth and Lady Macbeth have been played by the most famous actors and actresses of the times. The play has been adapted to films, television, opera, novels, comics and other kinds of media. It is about the tragedy of an ambitious Scottish nobleman who commits several murders in order to become the king. Shakespeare based some characters in the play, such as Macbeth and Duncan, on records of real people in a history book written in 1587. For example, the character of King Duncan in the play is based on King Duncan I, who ruled Scotland from 1034 to 1040. And the character Macbeth was roughly based on a Scottish king named Macbeth, who ruled from 1040 until his death in 1057. However, the events in the play are different from those that happened in real history. Macbeth was first printed in the First Folio of 1623. This is a collection of 36 plays by Shakespeare and the only source for the text of the play.

SUMMARY

The Scottish army is fighting to defend the country against the Norwegian invasion. Macbeth, who fights bravely in the Scottish army, and his friend Banquo, another brave soldier in the army, are returning from a victorious battle against the Norwegians. On their way, they come across three witches. The witches tell Macbeth that he will be the general of the King's army and that one day he will be the king of Scotland. They also tell Banquo that his sons and grandsons will be kings in the future.

As Macbeth and Banquo continue walking, they meet two noblemen sent from King Duncan's camp in Forres. They tell Macbeth that King Duncan wants to see him and reward him for his success and bravery. When the four men arrive at the King's camp, Duncan names Macbeth the general of his army. The King then decides to spend a night at Macbeth's castle. Meanwhile, Lady Macbeth receives a letter from her husband about his new position and the witches' words about his future. She is very excited and decides to help Macbeth become the king.

Shortly after Macbeth comes home, King Duncan arrives together with his sons Malcolm and Donalbain. Lady Macbeth has a plan to kill Duncan that night, while he is sleeping. She gives the king's servants a lot of wine to make them drunk. And according to her plan, Macbeth enters the King's room and kills him with the daggers of the two servants who are sleeping. At a very early hour in the morning, a nobleman named Macduff arrives at the castle to wake the King up and finds him dead in his bed and the two servants asleep. Then, Macbeth hurriedly goes to the King's room and kills the drunken servants. Duncan's sons are afraid of being killed too, so they escape. But this makes everyone suspect that they ordered the servants to murder Duncan.

Macbeth becomes the King of Scotland, but he is always very worried. He remembers what the witches said about Banquo's sons, so he hires two men to kill Banquo and his son. Banquo gets killed, but his son manages to escape. At the banquet that night, Macbeth sees the ghost of Banquo and talks to him, which makes everyone think he is mad. Macbeth becomes more and more worried, thinking that he has enemies. He hears that both Malcolm and Macduff are in England and are getting ready for a war against him. Eventually, Macbeth becomes a ruthless king and Lady Macbeth suffers madness due to her guilt.

Macbeth finds the three witches to learn more about his future. He finds out that he will be safe until a forest marches toward his castle and until a man who is not born of a mother attacks him. He also learns that Macduff is very dangerous for him. So, Macbeth has Macduff's wife and children killed. During this time, Malcolm, with the help of Macduff, arranges a big army to fight against Macbeth. When Macbeth learns this, he goes to his remote castle with his soldiers and prepares them for a battle. When the army, led by Malcolm, arrives and is marching towards Macbeth's castle, Macduff is with them too. The soldiers hold tree branches in front of them so as not to be seen by Macbeth's soldiers.

Macbeth is horrified when he is told that the trees are moving and approaching his castle. Meanwhile, Lady Macbeth is found dead. When Malcolm's army attacks the castle, Macbeth also fights against them. However, his soldiers lose the battle, and Macbeth is left alone on the battlefield. Macduff finds him and kills him with his sword. Then he brings Macbeth's head to the castle. All the lords and noblemen declare Malcolm the King of Scotland.


